- 1. Immediate increase in the supplies of PPE.
- 2. Immediate access to swab results or re swabbing if swabs cannot be relocated with a one day turn around similar to the acute services
- 3. Immediate onsite advice from Public Health experts.
- 4. Additional staffing at all levels (senior nurses, staff nurses, HCA's, hygiene and catering staff).

The situation is now extremely critical and if we do not get additional personnel and the other measures outlined, we cannot provide safe care and will have no choice but to transfer out residents to the acute hospitals.
