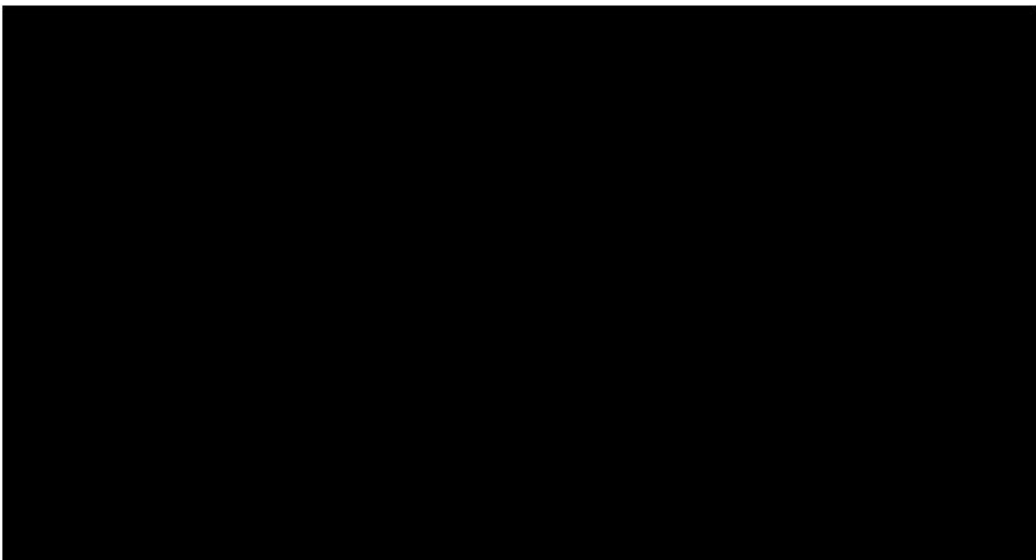

The high risk nursing homes that require as a priority targeted and resourced support are :

- [REDACTED] - ongoing
- [REDACTED] [REDACTED] - CHO area [REDACTED] involved - provider looking to move Covid 19 residents to another facility (**strategic approach required as providers will increasingly opt to take this option**)

- [REDACTED] Nursing home (CHO area [REDACTED] are aware - small nursing home ; 29 residents - centre has done as much as it can - **will require assistance**)
- [REDACTED] Nursing home (access to testing - we understand CHO [REDACTED] has stepped in)
- [REDACTED] Nursing home (consistency of supply of PPE)
- [REDACTED] Nursing home (CHO area [REDACTED] has indicated they are providing support)
- [REDACTED] - St. James hospital is redeploying resources.

These demands and the ability of some of the sector to respond will become increasing challenged.

It is important that we get a joined up approach to these increasing high risk centres:

– some providers are not equipped to manage this level of healthcare needs / ICP / access to PPE etc.....

- residents and their families are now beginning to contact us with concerns etc.

In the interim of the HSE's planned escalation pathway - can we have a teleconference to discuss?
