The high risk nursing homes that require as a priority targeted and resourced support are:

- ongoing
- CHO area involved provider looking to move Covid 19 residents to another facility (strategic approach required as providers will increasingly opt to take this option)

- Nursing home (CHO area are aware small nursing home; 29 residents centre has done as much as it can will require assistance)
- Nursing home (access to testing we understand CHO has stepped in)
- Nursing home (consistency of supply of PPE)
- Nursing home (CHO area has indicated they are providing support)
- St. James hospital is redeploying resources.

These demands and the ability of some of the sector to respond will become increasing challenged.

It is important that we get a joined up approach to these increasing high risk centres:

- some providers are not equipped to manage this level of healthcare needs / ICP / access to PPE etc.....
- residents and their families are now beginning to contact us with concerns etc.

In the interim of the HSE's planned escalation pathway - can we have a teleconference to discuss?
