Dear colleagues,

My two cents worth.

There is a lot of good work in the document so far. The case for joined up thinking in the field of healthcare regulation is very strong in the context of delivery of modern healthcare -- delivery of healthcare is integrated across professions and systems, there is no reason for healthcare regulation to be fragmented.

We need to work towards common principles of regulation across the sector. This will need to cover the following areas:

Governance

- -- Board composition: size, mix between lay and professional, expertise
 - careful delineation of functions/powers between board and executive

Fitness to Practice -- common principles

- -- substantive standard as to conduct/professionalism
- -- standard of proof (to best protect public)
- -- sanctions (role of executive/council/courts)
- -- procedures, facilitate early resolution and providing due process

Continuing Professional Development

- -- place on mandatory statutory basis
- -- develop accreditation model

Develop Principles on roll out of regulation to other parts of the healthcare workforce

- -- risk based
- -- cost effective

Generally we need to do a review of regulation to ensure that the regulators have the powers/resources needed to protect the public. My feeling is that some areas are not as well-resourced/empowered as the Medical council.

Dear All,

Firstly thanks Andy for your email to all, I think that was helpful – this is to start a conversation with the Department of Health, hopefully getting funding and support to initiate research looking at an evidence based approach before going anywhere near the governing bodies.

I have taken on the board the many comments and questions by the forum members. I have included them in this latest version – some of the questions do need answers, particularly Phelim and Bill, can you look at the 4 points under the Problem statement. I would be grateful if you could review and address.

I am sending two copies - with with amendments and one clean copy for ease of reading.

John Farrelly's response has been the trickiest (in italics)

We note the objectives appear to have changed and now appear to be suggesting a governance framework for healthcare regulators i.e. standards for regulatory enforcement. We are not sure how this aligns with our independence as a regulator? I think this relates to the fourth bullet point in the problem statement and maybe we should remove the wording in governance and just threader to overarching principles. I believe such principles would be a determinant of governance in this instance. One principle may be independence.

Do we need to put a specific comment on the independence of a regulator, once we follow our legislative remits?

The paper does not appear to include or reference, Regulating Better produced by the Office of the Taoiseach..

When I checked this out, it was issued in December 2003 and the office to support it was disbanded in 2011. We can of course quote the 6 principles Necessity, Effectiveness, Proportionality, Transparency, Accountability, Consistency as I know that this is at the heart of everything we are regulators do – would you agree? Ginny this is an old and dated and

obsolete document - I am aware of it but to some extent the OECD pronouncements on regulation supersede it. I believe we reference OECD in the document

Also, there are some minor points:

 The bullet point summary of the aims of Slaintecare do not align with the four goals set out in Slaintecare

I have put Appendix 1 in with the Goals of Sláintecare and referred to Goal 2 and 4 in the text – I hope this addresses the issue

Page 5 – sets out a number of functions which are said to be 'beyond the role of regulators in
other countries' – However, most of those functions would be common to other healthcare
regulators we have engaged with in comparable jurisdictions. The fact is that the way
regulation is set up in Ireland means that some of our functions do extend beyond that which
exists in regulatory bodies in other countries - we have multiple pieces of work in HIQA on
standards that demonstrate that. HTA is yet another example. It's just they way we've been set
up - not a criticism

I have no idea how to answer this - any help would be most welcome

- The paper does not include reference to health and social care areas that are not regulated in the hard sense e.g. acute, maternity
- I was not sure what he meant by this comment, if someone could help me understand or I could go back and ask him what he means???

I'm not sure either as we have published an international review on the regulation of healthcare services and these services are not always regulated in other countries - again one of the principles might direct be to direct regulation to those with greatest vulnerability profiles - the study would determine that.

Finally, as previously stated Our Commission would not agree to any recommendations been made on to government on policy without going through our board. That said I appreciate other forum members may not have this restriction.

I believe that your reply Andy on Monday addressed this issue

I would be keen to close this out. I would be very grateful if you could review and send a copy to the sub committee and Andy as we try to finalise this by Friday
